We will also discuss joint jurisdictional burning across ownership boundaries in the wildland urban interface. Participants will have the opportunity to explore fire effects at each site.

- 1) Roger's Road: A joint WUI burn between the Georgia Forestry Commission and the US Forest Service utilizing a Community Wildfire Protection Grant (aka Stevens Grant)

- 2) Reed Branch: A small fire-dependent wetland managed for rare species Presenters: Malcolm Hodges and Erick Brown (TNC)
- 3) Rock Mountain: USFS wildfire which is the focus of Thursday's case study Presenters: Peter Myers, Ryan Peacock and Jimmy Rickard (all USFS)
